REGISTRATION POLICY

INDIVIDUAL REGISTRATION – also refer Section 2 of the SSNA Inc. <u>Constitution</u>

- 1. Registration fees will be as stipulated and should include the relevant fees as set by the Parent Body and any Competition fees; and will be circulated to clubs prior to 30th November each year.
- 2. All players are required to register electronically as set down in the current SSNA Handbook, or Twilight and Summer Night Competitions Information.
- 3. All new players up to the age of 18 years must produce an original or photocopy of either a Birth Certificate, Extract of a Birth Certificate, or Passport, to the Club Secretary/Registrar who should then if appropriate accept their electronic membership application for the relevant club.
- 4. All players 10 years and upwards must produce a current coloured head and shoulders photograph as required by the SSNA to form part of the registration requirements.
- 5. Additional players may be registered by a Club/Team as per the relevant Competition Rules.
- 6. Clubs/Teams should ascertain whether players have previously played and make sure that they have not created a new ID number on the database; should a new record have been created the Club/Team should notify the SSNA.
- 7. After the registration of a team any further registrations must be made as required in the information distributed in relation to that Competition.
- 8. Any Club withdrawing a player from a team during the Competition shall give reason in writing.

LATE REGISTRATIONS.

- 1. Any current player who has played in Netball NSW Metro League or other Netball NSW competitions considered of an appropriate standard(excluding 15 years players), or Senior A1 grade in the previous three (3) years, cannot be late registered in any grade lower than A1, or the similar Summer Division, without the approval of the Grading Committee and the Executive. This application must be in writing from the Club/Team. A player retains the right of appeal.
- 2. After a team has been graded, any late registrations must be of an equal playing standard or lower. Previous experience and extenuating

circumstances are to be considered and at least one of the Association Registrars is to be involved in making the Decision. In the normal course, late registrations may not play lower than TWO GRADES, from the previous three years grading. In the event of an appeal, circumstances are to be reviewed by the Grading Appeals Committee. A player retains the right of appeal to the Executive Committee.

Any late registrations, which occur after the first round of the Winter Competition, in extenuating circumstances only, must be approved by the Executive Committee and will be dealt with on merit.
